

The Planning Committee, consisting of 10-12 members, is responsible for developing the long-term strategy of the CP Assembly. The committee serves two primary roles. The first is to review and support development of CP assembly project applications. This is accomplished by corresponding with project applicants via email to answer questions typically regarding application scope and methods, and then providing written constructive feedback after a committee scoring and discussion. The second key function of the planning committee is to develop and maintain CP assembly awards, as well as to select award recipients.
